
# G-d Dream

G-d Dream Prof. Andrew E. Colarusso What, historically and aesthetically, constitutes an oracular vision, a clairvoyant revelation, a sign from another dimension? In this class we will explore a variety of ecstatic visions, from the Revelations of John of Patmos and Dream of the Rood, to Timothy Leary and L. Ron Hubbard, all in an effort to hone our own innervisions of what exists beyond. In this multimedia workshop we shall be free to experiment with language, sound, light, pigment. Can our own creative endeavors become expressions of "...the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."?

**COURSE SELECTION:** writing sample required for admission into course.

**GRADING:** ABC/S Option available

THIS IS A WORKSHOP/SEMINAR, meaning we will have pointed discussions of our required reading materials, while also reading/exploring/being critical of our own creative works and the works of our classmates. As such, you will each be required to workshop at least 2 original pieces (though we can workshop more, time permitting), keep a dream journal, and complete a final project.

**DREAM JOURNAL:** Keep a dream journal. It can be an informal tumbler or more traditional notebook. The goal here is to document-observe what visions populate your dream space.

**FINAL PROJECT:** A comprehensive metaphysics. If you acknowledge such a thing as an afterlife or a cosmic order in the universe, what does it look like? In ten or fewer pages (12 font, double spaced) or < 10 minutes of film/media elucidate for us what is not clear to the eye, but plain as day in your heart and soul. Share with us your vision. **Due 4/19** 

ADHERENCE TO THE GOLDEN RULE (*Do unto others as you would have them do unto you*). It is my duty (and hope) to provide a space where we can be free in our expression of self. What are your honest thoughts and feelings? What concerns you or worries you? What did you appreciate about the text or performance? But this is not solely the responsibility of the professor. In our classroom we will strive to be as respectful *and* honest as possible—about literature, about ourselves, each other, and the world at large. As my homie once said: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." There will be NO discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, religious affiliation, political affiliation, or fashion sense.

### **DE-IDENTIFIED FEEDBACK:**

The etymological root of the word *education* (educere) suggests "leading one [out]". As such, I think effective teaching can and should make us uncomfortable, but never ask us to compromise our integrity. **Uncomfortable**, but never compromised. If something happens during the course that you feel compromises your integrity and you'd like to address it without identifying yourself or others, type up your grievance and leave it in the course mailbox. I will check monthly and do my best (as a trained mediator) to amend the situation with utmost tact.
